Eliciting Correct Production of f, v Sounds

The /f/ and /v/ sounds are made by biting the lower lip and pushing air through this constriction. With the cueing to "bite your lip" and seeing a model, the child should be able to produce this sound correctly. The /v/ sound is made by pushing more air through the constriction so that the vocal chords vibrate. /v/ is voiced, while /f/ is unvoiced. Feel your own throat while producing the two different sounds to understand better.
