Eliciting Correct Production of s Blends

Breaking apart the blend into its individual components is helpful. For example, if the difficulty is with "st" blend, first produce "s", then add "t" and the rest of a word. Try "s-s-s-t-t-t-op". If the difficulty is with "gr" blend, first produce "g-r-r-r-een". Because "g" is made quickly, you might move through it quickly, then elongate on the "r" sound. The goal is to gradually decrease the space between the sounds until they can be made in rapid succession.
