10 IDEAS TO ENHANCE LANGUAGEAS YOU PLAY TOGETHER WITH A VARIETY OF TOYS

Example: barn, house, gas station, school, airport, doll house, musical instruments

- 1. Describe the action for your child as s/he is creating it. Place emphasis on particular words of interest, such as nouns and verbs. Ex. "The **frog** is **jumping**."
- 2. Repeat and expand on whatever your child may say. Ex. Child says: "Boy sleeping." Adult says: "Yes, the boy is sleeping in bed."
- 3. Find and label parts of the objects or toys.
- 4. Count different items or parts of the toy.
- 5. Find different colors and/or match them within the toy. Continue to match to items within the immediate environment.
- 6. Create a story with your child about what is happening as you play. Ask him/her what might be going to happen next.
- 7. Find and describe similarities and differences between items or parts of the toy.
- 8. Create rhymes about what is happening during play. Don't be afraid to make up silly words.
- 9. For musical instruments, create a rhythm and see if your child can repeat it. Start with easy 2-3 beats, then make then increase difficulty.
- 10. Use different toys with the toy of choice to expand the play scenario. Ex. Introduce action figures to the dollhouse.
